

CONGRESSIONAL SEMINAR LEGACY SCHOLARS

Legacies* are welcome to participate in the NSCDA Congressional Seminar. Legacies are ineligible for the Congressional Seminar scholarships but may attend the Seminar at their own expense.

Process: Legacies must submit an application by **March 1** to reserve a space in the Congressional Seminar. Applications received later than March 1 will be accepted on a space-available basis.

<u>Application Form</u>: Legacies complete the Legacy Scholars application form posted on the Student Resources section of the <u>NSCDA website</u>. Legacy applicants submit their applications directly to the National Essay Consultant, Mary Bradshaw <u>mary bradshaw@comcast.net</u>. If a legacy submits his/her application to a local or Corporate Society Dame, the application may be delayed beyond March 1 as it will necessarily be forwarded to the National Essay Consultant.

Recommended Preparation: The Legacy Scholar is encouraged to study the assigned essay topic intently to be able to participate fully in discussions in the Seminar.

Legacy Fees: Fees for the Congressional Seminar tuition are due by **March 15**, payable
