### Biography:

Elizabeth Price Curd was the great-great granddaughter of John Price, the immigrant. He arrived in Virginia on the *Starr* by May 1611. His wife, Ann, came in 1620 aboard the *Francis Bonaventure*. He was living in Charles City in 1623-1625. In 1625 he was a member of the Assembly and drew up a protest to be sent to the King "against any change in government." By 1628 he had died.

He and his wife left three known children, one of which was Elizabeth's great grandfather, John Price. This John Price married \_\_\_Wall and they had two known children, Daniel and John Price. Daniel married Susannah Carter, daughter of Giles Carter of Henrico County. His wife was granted administration of his estate in 1692. They had one known child: Daniel.

Daniel Price, Elizabeth's father, was born about 1692. He was a churchwarden and vestryman of Henrico Parish. He and his wife, possibly Mary Hughes, had five known children. He left his will which was probated in March 1770.

Elizabeth Price married John Curd, who died by May 1752. Elizabeth and John had at least nine children and were living in Goochland County, when John applied for a license beginning in 1740 and renewed every year through 1746. Where their "dwelling" in Goochland County was located is unknown. Elizabeth received a license in 1755 to run an "Ordinary" at her "dwelling."

After Elizabeth's first husband died she married Richard Oglesby of Amherst County, Virginia.

Elizabeth died by July 1778.
